Presentation by Odile Wibault.

Nature paints landscapes, history builds cities, lifestyle is carved in stone. In this presentation, you will be given some cultural concepts and references to understand the evolution of urban architecture in the Loire Valley.

Visit of the Cadre Noir of Saumur.

The Cadre Noir of Saumur is a prestigious equestrian institution, known for its excellence in equestrian art, especially in classical horse training. The Cadre Noir strongly contributes to the international reputation of French equestrianism. At the Cadre Noir, you will discover ancestral equestrian traditions. You will also attend a spectacular horse show.





EQUESTRIAN CULTURE IN THE LOIRE VALLEY

2.30 P.M. - 4 P.M.

Presentation by Sylvine Pickel-Chevalier.

Horse and equine heritage plays a key role in France, especially in the Pays de la Loire region. Through the Cadre Noir of Saumur, the main custodian of French traditional equitation (UNESCO-listed), and the Vendée Stud, we will explore how horses have shaped the region's history. We will also see how tourism supports their conservation and revitalisation today. This evolution relies on stakeholders embracing a tourism culture. It requires diverse skills and collaborative cultural outreach projects with local communities.

WINE CULTURE IN THE LOIRE VALLEY

9.30 A.M. - 11.30 A.M.

Presentation by Johanna Thomas.

The conference will be an introduction to the world of wine and its key aspects: What is wine? How is wine made? How is it consumed? How is it regulated? What is wine tourism? What are the general trends and challenges in the world of wine today? This course will also include an introduction to wine tasting (theory and practice!), an introduction to food and wine pairing with a meal at a local restaurant, and the visit of a local winery, to experience wine tourism first hand.

Visit of the Pied-Flond wine estate.

At the Pied-Flond wine estate, nearly 25 hectares of vines are being grown on ancient soils, mainly sandstone and schist. Passionate about their craft, Franck and Catherine are working hard to nurture and to add value to their land. If you are a wine enthusiast, the Pied-Flond wine estate is the perfect place for you!

Introduction to the slate of Angers - visit of the *Mine Bleue*

Discover the slate's secrets in the former mining site "La Mine Bleue". Discover the blue shade of the Anjou region and enjoy the unique experience of a 126-meter-deep underground journey!

Introduction to the botanical world - visit of Terra Botanica.

Angers is the plant capital of France, and Terra Botanica, which is a unique theme park dedicated to the botanical world, celebrates that. Enjoy 17 hectares of games, rides, adventure trails and theme gardens. Learn more about plants in a fun and interactive way.

RELIGION IN THE LOIRE VALLEY

10 A.M. - 11.30. A.M.

Visit the Royal Abbey of Fontevraud.

The "Abbaye Royale de Fontevraud" is a UNESCO world heritage site. As one of the largest monastic complexes in Europe, it is a real gem of French heritage. This abbey was founded in 1101 by Robert d'Arbrissel and was mixed gender: both monks and nuns used to stay there, which was very unusual for the time.



2.30 P.M. - 4.30. P.M.

Visit the Royal Abbey of Fontevraud.

This abbey is also known for being formerly run by female leaders from a royal background. Nowadays, the Royale Abbaye de Fontevraud is a dynamic cultural centre hosting art exhibitions and concerts.

Presentation by Hedwig Verdure.

A journey through architectural history: Trace the evolution of architecture from the late Romanesque period to the 19th century through some examples of the Loire Valley castles. Many of them have stood the test of time, remaining among the most emblematic ones of their era.

Visit of the Château de Brissac.

The Château de Brissac is the tallest castle in France, hence its nickname "the Giant of the Loire Valley". Enjoy the mix of medieval and Renaissance style, while also discovering its various ornaments, the Belle Epoque theatre and mysterious myths.

Visit of the Château de Chambord.

Built in the 16th century under Francis I of France, the majestic Château de Chambord is one of the biggest masterpieces of the French Renaissance. It is the symbol of royal power and architectural innovation of its time. Thanks to its famous double spiral staircase, inspired by Leonardo Da Vinci, two people can go up the stairs without even going past each other.

Visit of the Château de Chambord.

With its 440 rooms, 365 chimneys and its large towers, this castle has a very impressive size while still being very harmonious. In its estate, you can find the widest fenced garden of Europe and a very well-preserved wildlife. After centuries of significant history, it is now an UNESCO world heritage site and attracts hundreds of thousands of visitors every year.

Introduction to the Loire tuffeau stone - visit of *Le Mystère des Faluns*

Carved into the stone, the troglodyte heritage is one of the main identity features of the Loire River and its tributaries. At The Mystère des Faluns in Doué-en-Anjou, you will enjoy an art trail in the majestic caves.

Renowned for its good quality of life and nestled in the heart of France's third-largest winemaking region, Angers invites you to discover new experiences. Wander through the narrow streets of its historic quarter, admire its exquisite heritage buildings, explore by bike, savour finely crafted wines, and immerse yourself in a vibrant cultural scene. With its charming parks and rivers, and cycling routes, nature is never far away.

In Angers, getting around on foot, by bike, or along the river offers a relaxed pace, where taking time to explore is a cherished value. Here, urban life and nature coexist in perfect harmony, creating unique, authentic, and enriching moments at every turn.

MAIN ATTRACTIONS IN ANGERS

- Angers Castle: its 17 towers stand as a testament to the city's historical significance. Now home to the impressive Apocalypse Tapestry, the world's largest medieval tapestry, Angers Castle offers a journey through time and artistry.
- St Maurice Cathedral: as the epitome of Gothic-style
 Plantagenet architecture, Cathédrale St Maurice captures the imagination with its intricate design and profound spirituality.
- Museum of Fine Arts: immerse yourself in Angers' history from 18th-century masterpieces by renowned French painters to contemporary artworks, this museum provides insights into the city's cultural evolution.
- The David d'Angers Gallery: housed in the meticulously restored Toussaint Abbey, the David d'Angers Gallery showcases the sculptor's works, offering a glimpse into the artistic brilliance that defines Angers.
- Museum of Jean-Lurçat and Contemporary Tapestry: witness history and modernity intertwine at the Museum of Jean-Lurçat. Jean-Lurçat's reimagined Apocalypse Tapestry and the awe-inspiring Chant du Monde tapestry both immerse visitors in a world of artistic marvels.
- The Collegiate Church of Saint-Martin: the Collegiate
 Church of Saint-Martin, a true architectural gem, stands as a
 masterpiece of Carolingian design, reflecting the city's cultural
 depth.

MOUTH-WATERING ANGERS SPECIALITIES

- Quernons d'Ardoise: a tribute to the roof slates that are typical of houses in this region, these are actually delicious blue chocolates. Crispy on the inside, they melt in the mouth!
- Anjou Liqueurs: Cointreau (orange liqueur), Giffard's Guignolet (cherry liqueur) and Menthe Pastille (Mint liqueur), all locally made.
- Typical local dishes: savour the culinary treasures of Angers, like, pike or perch with a delicate beurre blanc sauce, Crémet d'Anjou (sweet dessert made with fromage frais), pâté aux prunes (greengages baked in a pastry case)
